Stacey moved to approve the Superintendent Job Description as presented, pay the Sheep/Goat, Swine, and Beef Superintendents \$450.00 and to provide them with a camping spot during the fair, compensate a Small Animal Superintendent \$300.00 and a camping spot, compensate a Horse Superintendent \$350.00 and a camping spot, compensate the Barn Superintendent \$1,200.00, and to allow Don to sign 2022 contracts with the 2021 Superintendents. Nick 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion which carried.

### XII. Market Sale

a. Market Sale Agreement

Amy and Kenzie had made slight changes to the 2021 Market Sale Agreement and presented to the Board, Educators and Superintendents for suggested edits. The 4-H Educator (Kellyenne) had requested that 4-H Council be removed, and to change Extension Office to 4-H Educator. Those changes were made prior to the meeting.

Stacey moved to make the following changes to the presented agreement:

- i. 1h) Thank you letters: Must meet the requirements of the organization youth is selling under.
- ii. 10b)No Market sale checks will be released to youth until 80% of the Jr. Livestock Market Sale gross revenue has been collected from the buyers and those making add-ons, and there is enough funds in the Fair Board Operating Account to cover the checks.
- iii. 13a) Youth must meet the requirements of their species' Superintendent, and check-out with Superintendent at the conclusion of the Fair.
- iv. 13b) Delete

- b. Amy will speak to Wagonhound asking if they will donate the use of their scales for beef weigh-in on January 29<sup>th</sup>. Nick has confirmed a Glenrock weigh-in date of Tuesday, January 25<sup>th</sup>. Amy will do an inventory of EID tags.
- c. Amy will secure Brand Inspectors for the two dates.
- d. Market Sale Committee Nick will meet with the committee members to discuss and clarify their duties and Board duties prior to February 1st.

Don and Amy will make a check-list system that will ensure that youth have completed all duties for each phase of the process of selling an animal from weigh-ins/tagging, consigning, confirming buyer's desire for processing, to having their animal in the correct location to be loaded onto truck from processing.
